What a fabulous opportunity to get an interpretation of your own birth chart, and learn about astrology in general!

In this workshop, you'll find out why we act and react the way we do, not only with ourselves, but with others. Internationally-known psychic and medium Anne Gehman will deliver gallery readings, including messages from departed loved ones, Spirit guides and teachers. She will conclude by taking questions from attendees about spiritual philosophy and experiences. Rev. Anne Gehman, founder of the Center for Spiritual Enlightenment, NSAC, began having psychic experiences as a child. By the time she had finished school, she had gained wide recognition as a psychic and medium, and became the youngest person to be certified by the NSAC.

Anne is recognized worldwide as a psychometrist, clairvoyant and clairaudient. She was elected to the International Congress of Parapsychologists and Paraphysicists in Prague, Czechoslovakia. She has been featured in Jess Stearn's books, [Adventures into the Psychic](#) and [Miracle Workers](#), and Harold Sherman's [You Can Communicate with the Unseen World](#). Anne is listed among the top 100 psychics in the United States, and has worked with the University of Arizona on a research study regarding near death communication.

CSE SUPPORTER HAROLD BRECHER TRANSITIONS TO SPIRIT

Harold Brecher, husband of CSE member Arline Brecher, transitioned to Spirit on June 17. A memorial service and reception was held for him at the CSE on June 24.

Those who knew Harold found that he was a bright, witty and personable man. He had interesting and provocative spins on every issue, and delivered his stories with wry, warm humor. He and Arline co-authored several pioneering books on alternative health, including *Forty Something Forever*, and established the Health Savers business (www.healthsavers.info).

At his memorial, Arline and his two children, Sharon and Jerry, remembered Harold with speeches and a video. His friends and acquaintances took turns sharing stories of Harold's antics, including his victorious win of the neighborhood ping-pong tournament, and his belief that all living beings (plants, animals, and humans) thrive with love and encouragement. Harold was known for spontaneously reaching into his pocket, pulling out stickers of gold stars, and -- with a certain flair -- sticking them on the lapels of whomever he believed deserved one. If you would like to contribute to his memorial, Arline asked that donations be made to the CSE in Harold's memory.

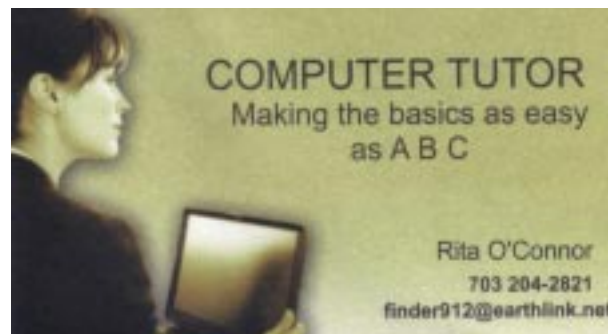

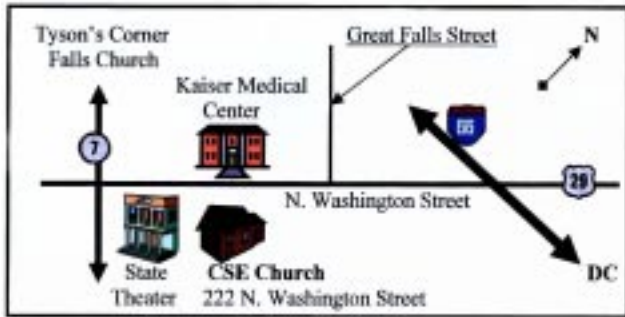
